



Pitch for Public-Private
Partnership Scheme in Sustainable
Parking and Urban Development





Introduction



Malta faces a pressing parking crisis due to high vehicle ownership and limited parking infrastructure. This challenge presents a unique opportunity for collaboration between the public and private sectors. We propose a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) scheme to develop innovative, selffunded projects that expand parking facilities, enhance public open spaces, and improve residents' quality of life while ensuring environmental sustainability.



Objective

Proposed Structure of the PPP Scheme

1. Request for Proposal (RFP):

The government will issue an RFP to invite private entities to submit proposals for identifying sites, designing, developing, and managing parking and urban development projects.

2. Project Scope:

Proposals should focus on mixed-use developments that incorporate parking, public spaces, and sustainability measures.

3. Evaluation Criteria:

Proposals will be assessed based on feasibility, innovation, sustainability, and community impact.

4. Funding and Revenue Sharing:

Projects will be self-funded by private entities, with revenuesharing agreements to ensure community benefits.

5. Monitoring and Evaluation:

A framework will be established to monitor project progress and evaluate outcomes, ensuring alignment with the study's strategic objectives.
